**BIG3 REGULAR-SEASON FINALE DOUBLEHEADER,
AUGUST 9 ON VICE TV**

**DMV TRILOGY (2-5) VS. DALLAS POWER (5-2)

Preview: The 2025 BIG3 regular-season draws to a close on Saturday as six teams vie for four coveted playoff spots. In the first game of VICE TV's doubleheader, the first place Dallas Power (5-2) take on the DMV Trilogy (2-5), while in the second game, it's the Chicago Triplets (5-2), the league's other first place team, against the playoff contending Detroit Amps (4-3), live from Los Angeles.

Last week, the Trilogy downed the LA Riot, 50-42, improving to 2-5 on the season. Earl Clark led all scorers with 23 points, adding 13 rebounds and two assists. Franklin Sessions scored 13 points, with four rebounds and three assists. Clark is having an outstanding season, leading the league with 63 rebounds and 13 3-pointers, and is tied for second (with Sessions) with nine blocks, and is third with 133 points. Sessions is also tied for first with three 4-pointers, while Isaiah Austin leads the BIG3 with 10 blocked shots. Playoff-bound Dallas is tied for first place at 5-2 and leads the league, tallying 343 points scored. Last week, the Power defeated Houston, 51-47. Glen Rice Jr. led all scorers with 20 points, with three rebounds and eight assists, while teammate Dajaun Summers added 15 points. Rice leads the league with 136 points and is tied for first with 27 assists. Greg Monroe is tied for third with 53 rebounds.

The BIG3's other first-place team, the Chicago Triplets, beat Miami last week, 50-41, to improve to 5-2. Montrezl Harrell led all scorers with 28 points, plus nine rebounds and two assists. Nasir Core scored 12 points, with five rebounds and two assists. For the year, Harrell is tied for third with 53 rebounds, and tied for fourth with 132 points. Core is tied for second with 11 3-pointers and tied for third with 20 assists. Chris Allen is tied for second with nine steals. Detroit's 52-40 loss to Boston last week dropped them to 4-3 and into a second-place tie. Cameron Smith led Detroit with 14 points. Jeremy Pargo, who is tied for first on the year with 27 assists, chipped in 10 points, eight rebounds, and four assists. Teammate Shakur Juiston leads the league with 10 steals.
